Scholarships Available for High School Graduates

lectric cooperatives in Virginia, Maryland and Delaware are preparing to accept applications for their scholarship from high school seniors who intend to pursue higher education studies.

The scholarships are awarded by the Virginia, Maryland & Delaware Association of Electric Cooperatives Education Scholarship Foundation, which since 2001 has provided approximately 998 scholarships to graduating high school students totaling more than \$900,000.

The open date for applications is Jan. 30, 2023, while the application deadline is April 3. Award recipients will be notified no later than June 1. The online application and additional information is posted at vmdaec.com/ scholarship.

Any high school or home-schooled senior graduating in spring 2023, and whose primary residence is served by a VMD member cooperative like BARC Electric Cooperative, is eligible

to apply for a \$1,000 scholarship to be applied to a two- or four-year college or trade school.

An applicant must be entering his or her first semester at a post-secondary or technical/trade school in the fall of 2023. Scholarship funds, which will be sent directly to the educational institution, must be used toward tuition, student fees, room and board, or textbooks.

The Foundation's board of directors will select recipients based on these weighted criteria: financial need at 40%, academic achievement at 40% and personal statement at 20%. Questions about donations and the application process should be directed to scholarship@vmdaec.com.

BARC BITES

Maple Balsamic Brussel Sprouts

In celebration of the Highland County Maple Festival in March, we are cooking with maple this month.

Ingredients:

- 1 to 2 lbs. brussel sprouts
- 1 tablespoon olive oil
- 2 tablespoons balsamic vinegar
- 1 teaspoon garlic powder
- 1 tablespoon maple syrup
- salt and pepper to taste

Directions: Preheat oven to 400 degrees. Rinse brussel sprouts, remove any damaged leaves and cut in half. Toss the brussels sprouts in olive oil, balsamic vinegar, garlic powder, maple syrup, salt and pepper and spread out on a lined baking tray. Bake, stirring once halfway through, for 20 minutes or until golden brown.

Portable Generator Safety



- Operate it outdoors in an area with plenty of ventilation. Never run a generator in a home or garage. Generators give off deadly carbon monoxide.
- Do not plug a generator into the wall to avoid back feed. Use heavy-duty extension cords to connect appliances to the outlets on the generator.
- Turn the generator on before plugging appliances to it. Once the generator is running, turn your appliances and lights on one at a time to avoid overloading the unit. Remember, generators are for temporary usage; prioritize your needs.
- Generators pose electrical risks, especially when operated in wet conditions. Use a generator only when necessary when the weather creates wet or moist conditions.
 Protect the generator by operating it under an open, canopy-like structure on a dry surface where water cannot form puddles or drain under it. Always ensure your hands are dry before touching the generator.
- Be sure the generator is turned off and cool before fueling it.
- Keep children and pets away from portable generators. Many generator components are hot enough to burn you during operation.

BARC suggests these safety guidelines and basic operating instructions be posted in the home and with the generator.

Highland County Maple Festival

March 11-12 and 18-19, 2023

t's so sweet! Nestled in the rural mountains of Virginia, travelers can take a step back in time for a cultural and culinary adventure at the annual Highland County Maple Festival during the second and third weekends of March.

Referred to as Virginia's Little Switzerland or the Maple Syrup Capital of the South, Highland County has been drawing tens of thousands of visitors to the community since 1959 to celebrate the "opening" of the trees and to observe the process of making delicious, pure maple syrup. Free "sugar camp" tours provide a unique and educational experience for the entire family to learn how the golden delicacy is made from tree to bottle, ranging from traditional to

modern techniques. Local sugar camps have even expanded to include syrups infused with fruits and spices or even aged in spirit barrels. Other tree syrups can be found at the festival as well, including hickory, birch and black walnut.

Bring your appetite, as the county-wide festival includes delicious maple treats, including famous maple doughnuts and all-you-can-eat pancake and buckwheat cake meals served by local Ruritan Clubs. Browse over 100 high-quality unique arts and crafts vendors from the East Coast for one-of-a-kind gifts. You can even sit for a spell and enjoy live entertainment featuring bluegrass music, square dancing and clogging.

In 1999, The Library of Congress designated The Highland County Maple Festival a "Local Legacy." In 2014, the Governor of Virginia signed a bill into law designating the event as the "official maple festival of Virginia." More recently, the festival has earned user-voted awards, including 2022's first-place place winner for best Festival of the Shenandoah Valley Region in Virginia Living's 11th annual Best of Virginia issue. The Highland County Maple Festival was previously awarded the best Food or Drink Festival distinction in 2020 and 2021.
